

Use this worksheet to decide how to use the steps of Preventive Teaching. We've given you an example to show you how it's done.

₽ EXAMPLE	1.	SAY SOMETHING POSITIVE ABOUT YOUR CHILD'S BEHAVIOR OR EXPRESS EMPATHY.	"When you're having fun playing outside, it can be hard to hear me call you to come in."
	2.	DESCRIBE HOW YOU WANT YOUR CHILD TO ACT.	"When I call, I need you to say 'okay' and come in right away."
	3.	GIVE THEM A MEANINGFUL REASON TO BEHAVE THAT WAY.*	"If you come in right away, you have a better chance of playing after dinner."
	4.	PRACTICE THE EXPECTED BEHAVIOR.	"Why don't we practice so it will be easier for you to know what to do next time."
	5.	FIND SOMETHING POSITIVE THEY DID DURING ROLE PLAY.	"Awesome! You did a great job responding 'okay' with a friendly voice."
	6.	ONCE DONE CORRECTLY, CONTINUE TO PRACTICE AT LEAST FOUR TIME.	"If you practice four more times with me, you will be able to have time to play outside after dinner."
		*Must be meaningful to your child.	
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
