₽ EXAMPLE	1.	SAY SOMETHING POSITIVE ABOUT YOUR CHILD'S BEHAVIOR OR EXPRESS EMPATHY.	"I know how much you like it when we eat at your favorite restaurant."
	2.	DESCRIBE HOW YOU WANT YOUR CHILD TO ACT.	"When we are out as a family, I need you to make eye contact and talk to the family and leave your phone in your pocket."
	3.	GIVE THEM A MEANINGFUL REASON TO BEHAVE THAT WAY.*	"If you're able to do this we will go back to your favorite restaurant again."
	4.	PRACTICE THE EXPECTED BEHAVIOR.	"Why don't we practice being in a resuarant and talking to your family ."
	5.	FIND SOMETHING POSITIVE THEY DID DURING ROLE PLAY.	"You did a great job asking questions and listening to my response."
	6.	ONCE DONE CORRECTLY, CONTINUE TO PRACTICE AT LEAST FOUR TIME.	"If you practice four more times with me, I'll let you get a dessert tonight when we go."
